

2014 EDUCATION PROGRAM

ELIGIBILITY: The program is recommended for students in the region entering grades 7-10, but others may apply. Priority will be given to students in grades 7-10.

FEE: There is no fee for the program.

SCHEDULE: Two three-week sessions are offered. The program runs Monday through Thursday, 8 AM to 12 PM. Students may participate in one or both sessions with regular attendance expected.

SESSION I:

July 7, 2014— July 24, 2014

SESSION II:

July 28, 2014—August 14, 2014



STUDENTS IN THE PROGRAM WILL:

Develop basic woodworking and boatbuilding skills;

Learn about the history of *Virginia* and the Popham Colony;

Build confidence and a sense of accomplishment while working on *Virginia*.

PROJECTS WILL INCLUDE:

- Introductory wood-working projects;
- Creation of a half-hull model or paddle;
- Trips to local boat-building or woodworking shops;
- Working alongside *Virginia*'s shipwrights; and
- Students will also learn about local history through hands-on projects and with local experts and speakers.
